## Captain Charlotte Levine

For service to America in the United States Army and the Jewish-American War Veterans Post 211

Charlotte Levine graduated from Newton South High School in 2013. She attended Cornell University, and graduated ranking as the number three cadet from over 5,500 ROTC cadets nationwide. A trailblazer, Charlotte was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army, serving as one of the nation's first female Armor Officers.

Following graduation from the Air Assault Course, the Armor Basic Officer Leadership Course, the Army Reconnaissance Course, and the Pathfinder School, Charlotte was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 66th Armored Regiment, 3rd Brigade Combat Team, and 4th Infantry Division. Charlotte served as a Tank Platoon Leader, Battalion Scout Platoon Leader, and a Tank Company Executive Officer, then deploying to the Middle East in support of Operation Spartan Shield. Charlotte went on to serve in the Tank Corps as the first female ground combat officer in the 4th Infantry Division where she was later promoted to Captain.

During Charlotte's accomplished military career, she commendably earned several awards, including the Army Commendation Medal, the Army Achievement Medal with Two Oak Leaf Clusters, the National Defense Service Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, the Armed Forces Service Medal, the Army Service Ribbon, the Overseas Service Ribbon, the Pathfinder Badge, and the Air Assault Badge. Charlotte received an honorable discharged from the U.S. Army in May 2022.

Charlotte earned a Master's in Business Administration from the Harvard Business School. She currently works as the Director of Strategy for NJ/NY Gotham FC, a professional women's soccer team. Charlotte also supports veterans' organizations, volunteering her time to advocate to increase the number of female veterans represented in top ranked graduate programs.
